completing maths challenges to help them recognise numbers and count beyond 5 and have enjoyed learning about rhyming words.

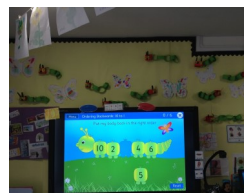


Reception (Butterflies)
