Nursery (Ducklings)



This half term we have been focusing on two different topics. On the topic "All About Me", we have been building positive relationship between our friends and the adults in the setting. We have been learning about our rules and routines, and how to follow instructions so that we can stay safe. We talked about

our families, what we like to do with them, and learning about our similarities and differences.

On the topic "How Many Colours in a Rainbow", we aimed to develop exploration and observation skills in our Autumn topic, focusing on the changes of the leaves on trees. Collage, drawing, and painting were our focus this term. We explored the colours of Autumn and experiment with printing materials.

Literacy

In Literacy, the books we focused on were Ruby's Worry, The Really, Really, Really, Really Big Dinosaur, Come Along, Daisy! and The Colour

Monster.

Come Along, Daisy/

A range of fiction and non-fiction texts have been used supplement the children's learning thoughout the topic.

Duckling's class had an exciting range of finger gym, writing opportunities across all areas of learning such as role play, investigation and small world.

Mathematical development

Our focus was on number. Counting, matching numbers to sets and using numbers in our play. We focused also use shapes for printing, sorting, naming and making pictures and patterns.

Communication and language

We aimed to develop sustained listening skills, through learning rhymes and listening stories. We encouraged the use of questioning, to find more, such as "why", and "how", "who" and "when". In talking, we want all the children to feel confident enough to make contributions to discussion in a group and to listen to other. Every day at circle time we discuss about our emotions focus around the book, The Colour Monster.

Wow Moments!

We would love to hear about those special Wow learning moments your child experiences out of school. It could be a new skill, such as swimming or riding a bike, independently getting dressed or using a piece of technology at home.




Reception/Year 1 (Cygnets/Swans)




Cygnets:

We are so proud of how Cygnets have settled in at Kents Hill during their first full half term. They are always busy learning and exploring and have a real keenness to keep active! They have been focusing on learning their first few letter sounds using our Read Write Inc phonics scheme and continue to learn more sounds and how to form the letters using fun materials and with writing resources. Cygnets have also been learning how to blend some of these sounds together to read short words such as, and, cat, mat. In maths they have been focusing on number recognition to 10, placing numbers in order and counting out a set amount of objects to match a number. During continuous provision, Cygnets have learnt to feel and describe pumpkins, create rangoli patterns, use various are materials to create animal pictures during our topic, Paws Claws and Whiskers. Lots of children really enjoyed sharing their learning with you during our Celebration Afternoon too! Keep up the astounding efforts Cygnets!



What an amazing first half term Swans have had, they have really taken on their learning roles in Year

One, like a swan to water! It is such a big step from learning in Reception and we are immensely proud of each of them. During English we have really tried embedding the basics of capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. Please can you continue to practise these skills at home. We also wrote a recount about meeting Murphy the dog and our Autumn Walk. We had great fun changing the story about a pet who came to tea too! In maths we have been learning to use different resources to help us develop our math skills e.g. tens frames, number lines, part part wholes and bead strings. Feel free to ask your child about

As part of our topic we have also designed and made a carrier for a pet, collected data on the most poplar pet and represented this in a pictogram.





Year 2 (Flamingos)



Year 2 have had a very busy half term learning all about castles. We have enjoyed learning about different castles in the UK, the different parts of a castle and even the different jobs you can have in a castle...why don't you ask your child what job they would or wouldn't like to have if they worked in a castle...?!?





In English we enjoyed making marmalade sandwiches. The children have worked really hard to learn and use some new "spicy words" to improve their spoken & written vocabulary. Please see attached sheet for their spicy words which you could encourage your child to use in a sentence at home too.

In Maths, we have been solving lots of number problems...putting numbers in the correct order, solving number puzzles, finding 1 more, 1 less, 10 more & 10 less and finding different ways to represent numbers. We have also been using column addition to add numbers together. After half term we will be moving onto our times tables, so please use the half term to practise counting in 2s, 5s & 10s.

The whole school have enjoyed learning about Diwali. Year 2 made some amazing Diva lamps.


Mrs Hayer gave a demonstration in how to tie a sari which was beautiful to watch.
