

This half term brought us lots of activities, we explored World Book Day as the children were invited to dress up as their favourite characters and bring in their favourites books. The day was spent looking at the books the children brought in and allowing them the chance to talk about why it's their favourite.



How can I encourage my child to talk more?

Try these tips to practice your verbal communication skills at home:

- Use things your child is interested in for play, follow their lead and make sure you are physically at their level while playing.
- Picture books introduce your child to new things they haven't seen yet in real life- ask them to tell you the story, or talk about what characters might be thinking and feeling.
- * Make reading, singing and playing even more fun by using lots of actions and different voices.
- * Take turns to make noises or speak- your child will be able to hold longer conversations, so slow down your speech, give them plenty of time to respond and listen carefully to what they have to say.
- * Talk to your child in short, simple sentence, as it's easier for them to understand you have a go at copying when they are ready.
- Try to use the same book or sing the same song, as young children learn a lot form repetition.

Reception (Cygnets)

learn. We have continued with our topic, Once Upon A Time, which the majority of our learning has been linked to. Recently we have taken part in recognising the value of Science and took part in National Science Week. The theme was 'connections' and we learnt about how the food we eat is connected to plants and how plants get their energy from the sun through the food chain. Cygnets planted Sweet Pea seeds, we

are watering these and hoping they will grow big and tall so these bees can collect nectar to make yummy scrummy honey! We met Professor Pauling during Science Week. She was very silly and taught us all about how to be a super scientist. We worked in small groups to design a floating Lego boat to transport a message of what we had planted.
Some floated, some needed more work but science is all about learning and improving.



Cygnets continue access learning and exploring as part of their daily timetable to access all areas of learning through play. In phonics some children are reviewing set 1 sounds and some have moved onto set 2. Please continue to practise the sounds at home and help your child to segment/blend sounds in words. We encourage them to hear and say each sound and use their Fred fingers to squeeze the sounds on. This can then help them remember the order and write the word.

The children have started thinking about how to use their words and turn these into written sentences with support. Some children are learning that a sentence has finger spaces and a full stop at the end. In Maths ,they have been thinking about comparing and measuring weights and adding and subtraction within 10 or higher numbers.

We are looking forward to relaxing, practising our learning and reading over the Easter break and coming back ready to learn in the summer term! Keep up the amazing efforts Cygnets!



SWANS -YEAR 1

Another half term full of awe and wonder for Swans. We built on our learning from Spring 1'Bright Lights Big Cities', learning about what London is like now and its landmarks. This half term we looked at the history of London, particularly the Great Fire of London! Did

you know the fire started on Lord's Day 2nd September 1666, ask your child what Lord's Day means and see if they can tell you. First we read the story, Toby and the Great Fire of London to learn some interesting facts and we wrote a newspaper report in chronological order. Then we pretended to be alive during the time of the fire and write diary as if we were really there in London. We used adjectives and past tense verbs as well as trying to use some spicy words to make our writing even better! We had a great time in learning where certain foods came from when we made bread rolls a few weeks ago, just like Thomas Farriner would have made.



Recently we have taken part in recognising the value of Science and took part in National Science Week. In Maths we have been learning about comparing and measuring weights and how to find the difference between lengths or height. We have used different resources to help us such as scales, cubes, string and drawing our own number lines. More recently we have looked at odd / even numbers and doubling / halving amounts. You might like to practise recalling doubles with your child at home. What a super Spring Term Swans, you are becoming much more independent with your learning and endeavour to get on to a Digger Deeper Challenge!



Year 2—Flamingos



Year 2 have had a very busy half term.

In English, we have been learning about different minibeasts and remembering some unusual facts about them...
