

Samuel Wilderspin was a teacher, who is known as the founder of infant education. He had enjoyed learning at home and looked forward to going to school. When he started school, he didn't like the strict teachers or the boring lessons. He believed that children should enjoy school and be happy. He invented the school playground, so that children could play outside.

Samuel Wilderspin had four important rules about teaching children:

- Children should be given good food to eat at school.
- Teachers should explain everything properly so that children could learn.
- Children should not be given too much work to do or be given work that they could not understand.
- Children should be allowed to play and sing as well as learn reading, writing and maths.
